As a new year of faith formation approaches, we are eagerly preparing for in-person learning at all grade levels. Our theme for this year is *Created for a Purpose*. As a faith community, we will be pondering, praying about, and discussing the plan that God has for each one of us.

In addition to weaving our theme into our classrooms, we are also pleased to introduce a new adult faith series that will take place once a month during your child's religious education session. Monsignor Larry will be the primary presenter for these sessions, with Bishop Donald Hying joining us for the February presentation. With a growing program, we are currently ***in need of additional catechists and catechist aides for grades 1, 5, and 6***. All lesson resources and support are provided, as well as a small stipend for each session. And the reward of working with children is fantastic!!! 
We are called to 'Go Make Disciples' – but so often we don't know how.


